#### How to Calculate Your Plan Specific Expense Ratio

Your Allocation Report may reflect expenses specific to your plan such as actuarial expense and legal fees as well as expenses you directed FPPA to pay from your plan assets. These expenses are reflected in the line items *Plan Directed Expenses* and *Direct Expense Allocation*. As such, your plan's administrative expenses may differ from the Pool. In order to calculate your plan's administrative expense ratio, you will need to add the line items *Plan Directed Expenses*, *Direct Expense Allocation* and *Allocated Fees & Expenses* and divide by the *Ending Balance*.

#### **Allocation Methodology**

Investment Expenses and Allocated Fees & Expenses are separately allocated and separately reported in the Allocation Report. The Investment Expenses are allocated to each plan based on the plan's proportion of total assets. The Allocated Fees & Expenses are allocated based on the plan's proportion of total membership, including active, inactive and retired members as of December 31 of the prior year as defined by the guidelines within the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report. Member counts may be adjusted during the year for plan affiliation, disaffiliation, or reentry.

The SOC 1 Type 2 report has been provided since 2014 to assist employers in reporting in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 68 (GASB 68), *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions*. Actuarial services include the biennial funding valuation report (issued in odd years for Volunteer Firefighter plans and even years for Old Hire plans) and the annual GASB 68 report. Actuarial services are provided by Gabriel Roeder Smith & Co. Audit services are provided by Eide Bailly LLP.

#### **Payment of Settlor Expenses**

The Department of Labor believes that the employer should bear the cost of settlor expenses. If you agree, you should reimburse the plan for these expenses.
